## Word of the Great King | the gift of living under authority

An Identity That Never Lets You Down Matthew 16:24-28 June 26, 2022

Introduction: We're rightly suspicious of authority. "Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely," Lord Acton quips. But one day Jesus met a Roman soldier who understood the power of being under power. "I am a man under authority," he says, and because I am, "I say to one 'Go', and he goes." Maybe today we feel so impotent because we're so intent on throwing off authority and becoming our own. The Bible offers an alternative: to find the authority in our lives under the authority of a great King.

Prayer: Father, help us to turn to Christ for our identity. Amen.

## Discussion:

- 5. What is your understanding of verse 28?
