The Beauty of Reconciliation

Introduction: God has a plan. His plan is not random and God's plan is good. God's plan wends its way through all times, all places and all people. Yes, God even has a plan for you! The prophet Jeremiah says it this way: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.' (Jeremiah 29:11). - 3. Paul refers to both his "ministry" of reconciliation and his "message" of reconciliation. What is the difference?
- 4. What does it mean to be an ambassador (v20)?
- 5. How is it possible for us to be the righteousness of God?

Application: This week, provide messages of reconciliation to those you meet.
